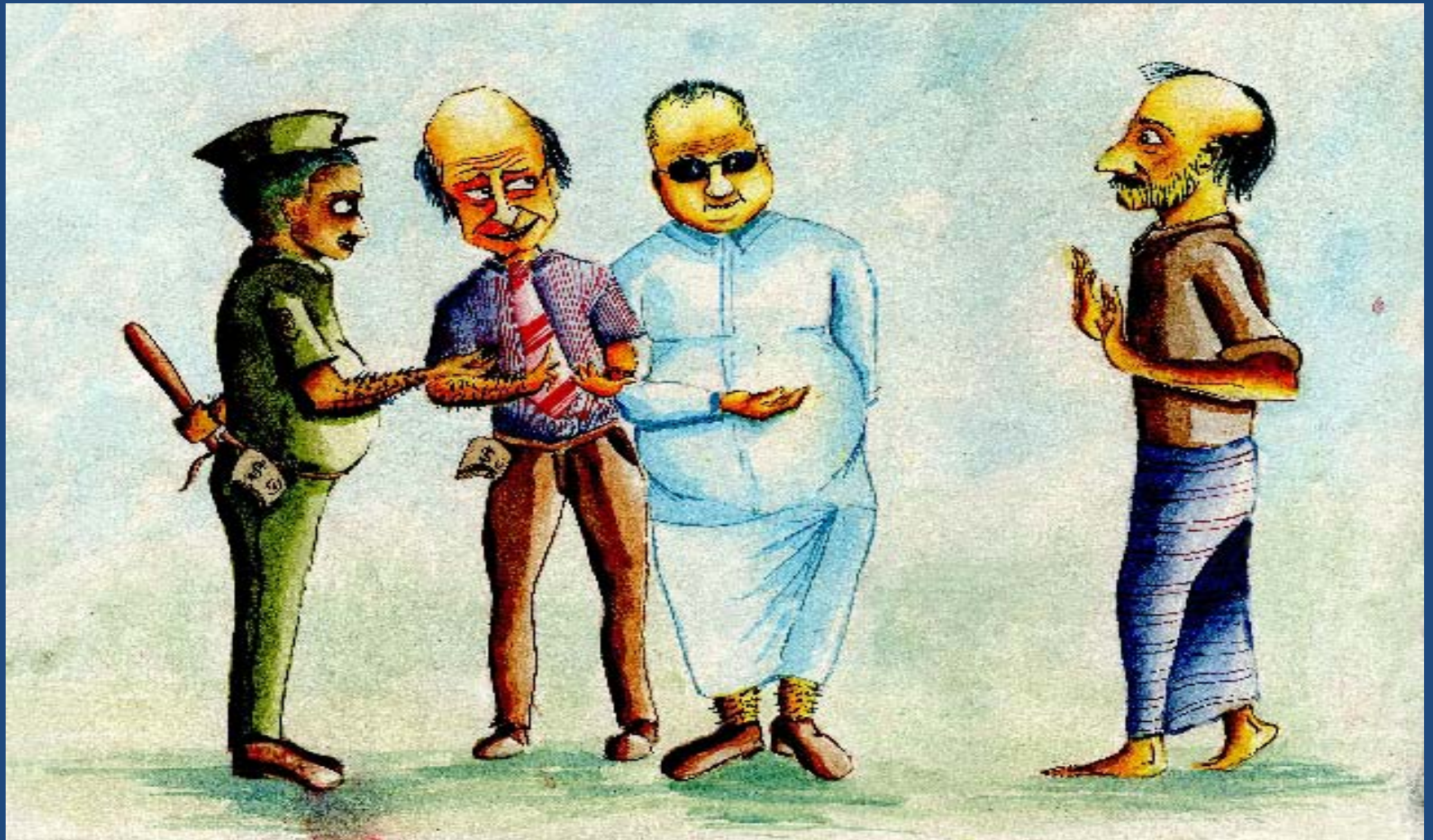

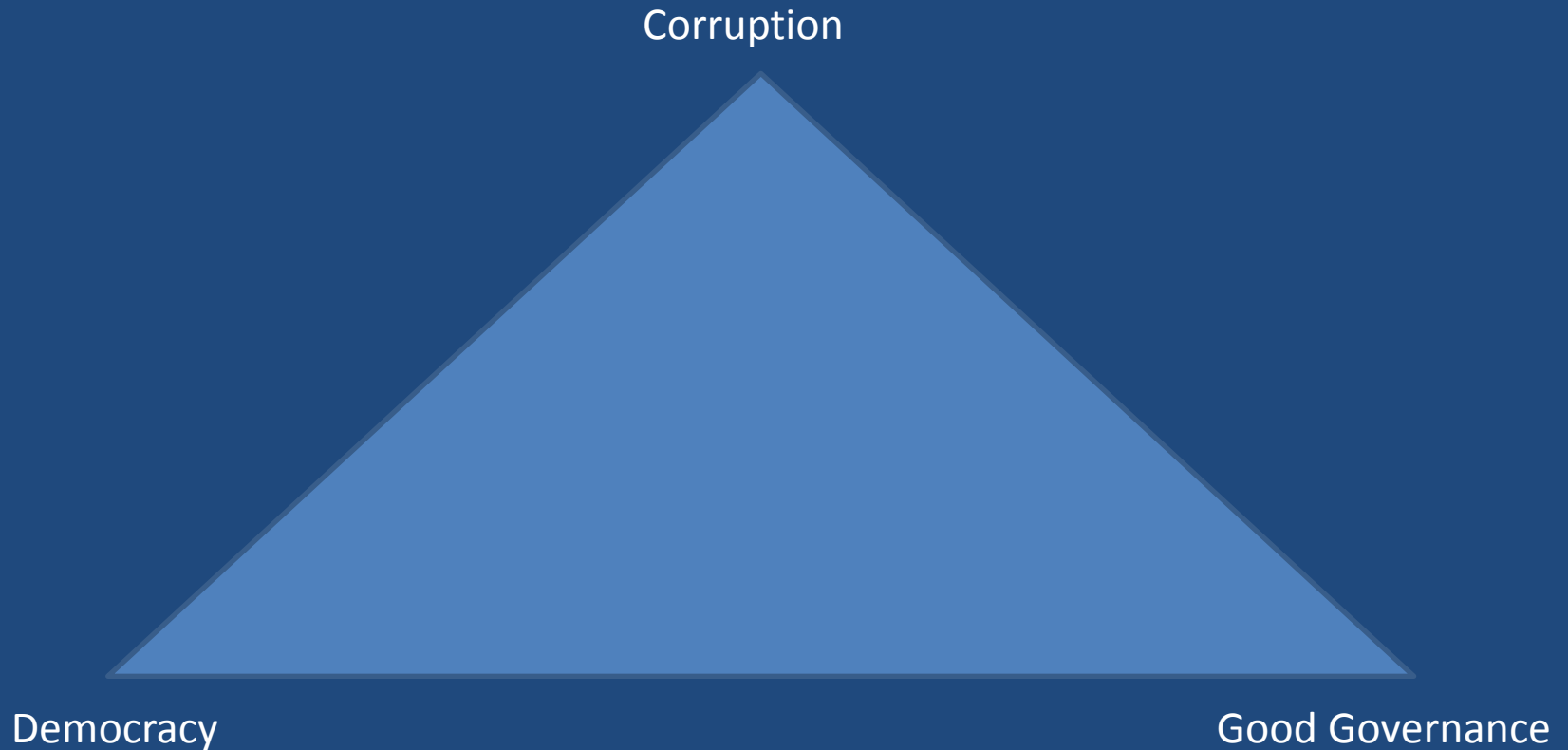
Corruption
